

August 2: The Nature of Man—Living Souls

Willingly Going Alone

"The Christian cannot simply take for granted the privilege of living among other Christians. Jesus Christ lived in the midst of His enemies. In the end all His disciples abandoned Him. On the cross He was all alone, surrounded by criminals and the jeering crowds. He had come for the express purpose of bringing peace to the enemies of God. So Christians, too, belong not in the seclusion of a cloistered life but in the midst of enemies. There they find their mission, their work."

—Dietrich Bonhoeffer, *Life Together*

This quote wrestles with my inner concept of how I do ministry. It feels good to surround myself with those that think the same way as I do, secure and comfortable with other Christian believers as I do life. But as I do, I run the risk of not serving the greater command from Jesus to go into all the world and make disciples.

I was filling up my car at a gas station. Just as I started, there was a man who was filling up his car just on the other side of the gas pump dispenser. We were 3 feet away from each other. Most of the time I would focus on just filling up the gas without even a glance at the other guy, let alone say anything, but this quote was going on in my mind and so I mustered up the courage to say, "So... um how are you...?" The man didn't respond. I said it again, "How are you?"

This time, he turned around and said, "Are you talking to me?"

"Yes, I have noticed that people don't talk to each other very often even when standing in close proximity to one another."

I want to say that initiating this conversation opened the door to immediately being able to talk about the love of God, but it didn't. It did, however, tell me that conversations have to begin somewhere. I have come to the conclusion that I must not allow myself to think that the Christian life is simply surrounding myself in the ease of other Christians. I must be willing to go alone on behalf of Jesus Christ. I am going to purpose to look for opportunities to connect people to the peace of God. I hope you will join me.

May we be willing to speak on God's behalf even when we are alone. May we be willing to serve others on God's behalf even when we are not in church and in our comfort zones. May God give us the boldness and obedience to reach someone with His peace found in Jesus.
