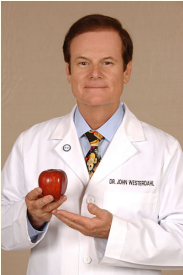

Be imitators of God, therefore, as beloved children, and walk in love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant sacrificial offering to God.
—Ephesians 5:2

Maximilian Kolbe was a Polish Franciscan friar whose church provided shelter to thousands of refugees, including Jews, during World War II. He was eventually arrested and imprisoned in 1941 and placed in the notorious Auschwitz concentration camp. In July of that year, three men escaped, and as punishment, the SS commander ordered ten men to be starved to deter further escapees. Fr. Kolbe was not one of the men, but when one of the chosen begged for mercy, he volunteered to take his place. During the entire time, he calmly led the others in prayer, and after three weeks, he was the only one left. Eventually, the commander ordered him to be killed with an injection of carbolic acid. Fr. Kolbe willingly gave the executioner his arm.

It's not often that we have opportunities to give of ourselves as a sacrifice for others in such a dramatic way. These kinds of stories resonate with us as examples of what we hope our faith and experience in Christ will inspire us to do in times of challenge. Willingness to give of our life for someone else hides in the recesses of our minds and we hope it will come out to show that we are like Jesus.

This opportunity to sacrifice out of love, the kind that is a pleasing fragrance before God, is given to us more often than we take advantage of.

It happens in the stores when someone has twelve items in the *10 Items or Less* line and you smile instead of glare, or when you have a cartload of items and the person behind

you only has a few, and you let them go in front of you. It happens when you allow someone to win an argument because the relationship is more important than proving yourself right. It happens when you do the chores at home even though you are tired, because you don't want your wife or husband to have to do them.

I just recently saw a commercial where the mother is busy making the dinner for the family and she is all by herself. The son walks in to get something to drink from the refrigerator and after shutting the door, looks over at his busy mother and said the question, "Can I help you mom?" The mother, surprised, smiled and said yes and the two of them started to work together to complete the meal. It was a commercial for Pillsbury dough but the message is clear that sacrificially serving one another is the pleasant fragrance that truly honors God. Maybe, as we think about the sacrifice of Jesus for us, we can take advantage of the daily little opportunities to sacrificially offer ourselves on behalf of others.
