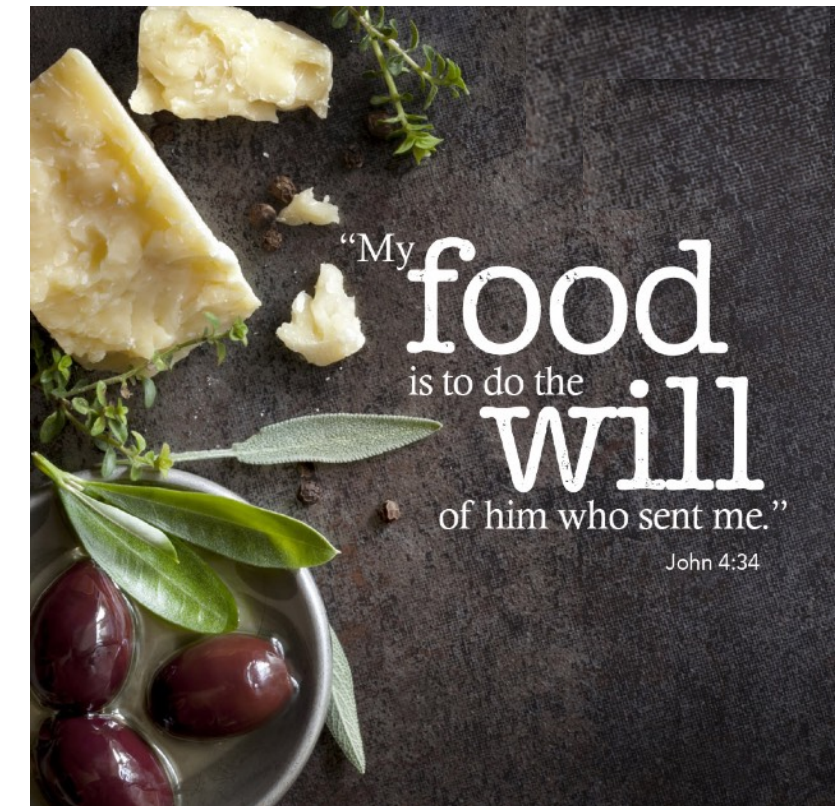

“Fountain Living”

John 4:7-14:

A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give me a drink.” (For his disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.) The Samaritan woman said to him, “How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?” (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.” The woman said to him, “Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water?... “Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.”

As a Christian, I have passed by this verse so many times without giving it much thought. The question stirs in me as well, “How do you get water, living water, unless you have something to draw the water with?” What part of my daily life brings me to water fountain living?

When I was young, my Grandpa and Grandma lived in Dunsmuir CA. and ran the Napa Auto Parts store in the town. Being young, I was allowed to explore within a certain distance of the store the main street store fronts in the little town. Just 2 stores down, the city put a perpetual water fountain with a sign on it reading, “Dunsmuir, Home of the best water on earth.” I would drink from this fountain with the thought that I am drinking the best water in all the world. I remember it being cold and fresh on the warm summer days and the stream of water continued. It never turned off because there was no handle to control the stream of water, it just constantly flowed.

When I think about living water springing forth a fountain, I think of that water fountain from my childhood and ask myself, “Am I a source for the best water on earth?” Do I constantly flow the goodness of Jesus in my life, or do I have a turn off switch that controls the flow of Jesus to others? What do I use to draw the living water that turns my life into a fountain?

Fountain Living comes in the presence of Jesus. Jesus turns regular life into fountain life. My life should flow the refreshment of Jesus to others even on hot days, where things aren’t going well. The hot days should not affect the water in me, but the fountain of water should give refreshment to others suffering from the hotness of their situation. I need to realize that in Jesus there is refreshment. I have eternal life. And whatever difficulties I might have in life, I am a fountain for His love.

I realize that sometimes I feel as dry as the Sahara desert. Dusty - Dry - Barren of life. - A tumbleweed rolling by as I deal with the drought. But in this story, Jesus gives us the solution to our dryness. ASK. Every time my life feels parched, ask that Jesus would flow over me. Release the dryness, and receive the refreshing. Jesus tells me I am loved, I am forgiven, I am wanted, I am His. Realizing that Jesus my Savior feels this way about me, causes me to overflow to fountain living. My prayer today is that I have this sign on me, “Jesus, Home of the Best Water on Earth.”
